1. Phonics

- 1. Please practice identifying the 26 alphabet letters (capital and lowercase).
- 2. Please review the 26 letter sounds (see "Alphabet Chart" document).



IDEAS:

- 1. Get some chalk. Go outside with your child and have him/her write the letters on the sidewalk or driveway.
- 2. Spread a shaving cream on your kitchen countertop. Have your child write the letters in the cream.
- 3. Get some lower case magnetic letters. Put these on your refrigerator door. Your child can practice naming the letters and sounds daily.

2. Reading

IDEAS:

- 1. Practice writing the words using markers, pens, and crayons.
- 2. When reading, frame these words in the text with your fingers.
- 3. Use magnetic letters to spell the words on your refrigerator.
- 4. Please practice reading daily with your child.

3. Writing

- 1. Please practice writing your first and last name using proper capitalization.
- 2. Please practice writing the word wall words.
- 3. Have your child try to write a sentence using word wall words (you could make a sentence and have your child copy).

4. Math

- 1. Please practice identifying the numbers 1-20.
- 2. Practice writing the numbers 1-20.
- 3. Please practice counting objects to 20 (examples: beans, paper clips, pasta, toys).
- 4. Please review plane shapes (triangle, circle, square, oval, and rectangle).
- 5. Please review colors with your child (pink, orange, blue, yellow, green, white, black, brown, purple, red, and gray).
- 6. Please practice the AB (example: circle square circle square) and ABC (circle square triangle circle square triangle) patterns at home.
